Thanet Coastal Wardens Log

hanet's Coastal Wardens have sprung into action this year by helping the Sandwich Bay Bird Observatory with a Turnstone disturbance survey and a coordinated coastal bird count. Both research projects were commissioned by Natural England to monitor the abundance of coastal birds and what level of disturbance occurs at their roost sites.

Training activities at the end of last year saw the volunteers going over the cliffs at Botany Bay with coastguards from Thanet, Herne Bay and Deal on a training exercise. The coastguards did a wonderful job, demonstrating how they execute small cliff rescues by abseiling down to the beach with volunteers in-tow, as well as explaining all the equipment used in rescues and finishing with a tour of the Cliftonville station.

2008 is shaping up to be a busy year, with double the usual amount of events for Coastal Wardens to help run and pass on their marine knowledge. Training events are listed in the box on this page. Seaside session

isitors to Thanet's Visitor Information Centres can now learn more about the coast, after staff joined the Thanet Coast Project team for a training session. As well as hearing how beach visitors can reduce their impact to our shores by following Thanet's Coastal Codes, the tourism team got stuck into a beach clean and took to the seas with Horizon Sea Safaris.

TIRELESS WORKERS!

ommunity groups and businesses have been taking to Thanet's shores ready to tackle the rubbish washed up over winter. The Ursuline College and Hartsdown schools' outdoor pursuits groups wheeled a tractor tyre off Pegwell Bay, but the Standard Chartered Bank team went one step further, using hacksaws to cut twisted fishing nets off Minnis Bay's railings!

Coast on the curriculum

• Pupils from Spires Academy took to the beach with the Thanet Coast Project and environmental artist Ruth Cutler. The pupils spent the morning exploring Botany Bay's chalk features, and the afternoon using the coast as their inspiration for sand sculptures. • Over 4,500 of Thanet's primary school children have learned about staying safe on the beach and protecting wildlife, in water safety lectures run by Thanet Leisure Force's head lifeguard Chris Betts, HM Coastguard Dave Melmoth and the Thanet Coast Project's Education Officer, Naomi Biggs.

MANAGEMENT ACTION

The North East Kent European marine sites (NEKEMS) Management Scheme 2007 – 2012 aims to safeguard important marine and coastal wildlife and habitats, whilst allowing activities to take place without damaging these features. It includes specific actions to achieve the effective management of the marine sites and surrounding areas.

All the actions in the Action Plan are a direct outcome of coastal users' discussions, held during a series of three workshops in 2006, and these can be viewed online at **www.thanetcoast.org.uk** The Action Plan includes a strong monitoring component, recognises the ever-changing coastal environment whilst allowing the management decisions to the made by local people. The action points are shared between the ten relevant authorities on the NEKEMS Management Group and the Thanet Coast Project.

Actions include the local implementation of the Shoreline Management Plan and completion of the Waste Water Treatment Works at Foreness Point, Fisheries related research will look into effects. of shellfish harvesting and possible V-notching of lobster as a way of management. There is a proposal to extend the shore-based voluntary codes from Thanet along the coast to the Canterbury and Dover areas. New measures will explore management of 'off-road' vehicles. kite-propelled activities and integrating the activities within the Sandwich and Pegwell Bay area. Other research will look at the public pressure from increased activities such as rock-pooling, possible control of non-native species and collaborative work on producing fossil extraction guidelines.



Safeguarding important marine and coastal wildlife and habitats, whilst allowing activities to take place without damaging these features.



The majority of the actions fall within the Thanet Coast Project's responsibility, and these have recently been agreed by the Management Group within a new Business Plan 2008-12. The main actions include the training of local volunteers or 'coastal champions', raising awareness and concern about wildlife through green tourism, reducing unintentional harm through encouraging responsible use of the coast, and engaging diverse local community groups.

he Sandwich and Pegwell Bay National Nature Reserve is one of the most important nature conservation sites in Britain. With its complex mosaic of coastal habitats and unique location on the migratory flight path, the site holds a plethora of nature designations.

Up to 12,000 golden plovers and internationally important numbers of turnstones are present in winter, together with thousands of other waders and wildfowl which feed on the rich supply of shellfish, crustaceans and marine worms in Pegwell Bay. Breeding birds include redshank, shelduck, oystercatcher, ringed plover and formerly the rare little tern.

It is no surprise that visitor numbers reach 250,000 annually, especially as the public are encouraged to visit and enjoy the site, and learn more about its coastal environment. The primary purpose, however, of a National Nature Reserve is to set aside an area where wildlife comes first. It is therefore crucial that all visitors carry out their coastal activities responsibly and with wildlife in mind.

he Kent Wildlife Trust and Thanet Coast Project have been working with representatives from different user groups to try and limit disturbance to wildlife at the National Nature Reserve. A few tips on how to reduce your impact on wildlife whilst enjoying the Pegwell and Sandwich Bay National Nature Reserve, include:

- Prevent disturbance to feeding, breeding and roosting birds by keeping to the coast path and Country Park at all times and do not allow your dog onto the saltmarsh and mudflats
- Give birds space, along the shoreline, to allow them to rest and feed properly

Local Activity Agreements

Two local agreements to help reduce disturbance to wildlife within Sandwich and Pegwell National Nature Reserve have arisen from workshops involving local people. In December 2007, a new agreed action involved baitdiggers and birdwatchers, adding to a previous kite surfing agreement with local users.

North East Kent Coast Workshops

New workshops are planned for 2008 with local people. One will be held for local wildlife boat operators to agree guidelines to reduce their impact on marine wildlife and help with scientific recording of marine wildlife around our coast. Another workshop has been identified to produce better fossil extraction quidelines for our area.


