Coastal Warden Corner

he Coastal Warden Scheme will be celebrating another successful year during its 2nd anniversary event in November. Over 100 wardens are regularly out and about in Thanet keeping a close eye on their adopted bays - making our coastal volunteer scheme one of the most popular in the country.

Volunteer Coastal Wardens monitor human and wildlife activities around the coast and provide a range of information for the Thanet Coast Project.

As well as detailed reports on coastal activities. wardens have snapped some colourful digital photographs, which are useful for illustrating incidents and activities and how individual bays are changing over time.

Earlier this year, wardens took part in a 'Biotope Survey Day' at Dumpton Gap. The day was organised by the Kent Wildlife Trust to trial a new way for recording the different types of wildlife on our shores. Global Positioning System equipment was used to build a grid map of the wildlife in Dumpton Gap.

Naomi Biggs, Thanet Coast Education Officer, said: "The wardens have been testing my marine life identification skills. Volunteers are increasingly visiting rockpools to carry out shorelife surveys. Colourful photos of weird and wonderful sea creatures have been flooding in, among them include pictures of squid eggs, chitons and grey sea slugs - not exactly your average sealife! But it's great as it means Wardens are getting so used to their patch they are exploring by themselves and learning new species all the time."

The nature of our coast: where have we got to?

It's been a busy year for the Thanet Coast Project and our coastal users

he main coastal user groups representing the activities and interests along our coast - have been working with the Coast Project to revise the North East Kent European marine sites Management Scheme.

This document sets out the major issues affecting our coastline and also how different groups of coastal users, such as fishermen, surfers, dog walkers and youth groups will work together with the Thanet Coast Project to protect our unique coastline.

Three stakeholder workshops were held and

were independently facilitated by Dialogue Matters. By coming to the workshops, stakeholders have helped to influence what will go into the next Scheme. They have looked at what has gone well and not so well in the past six years, possible solutions and a range of actions and ideas for the next six years. The next step will be to launch the revised scheme in the next few months, once an action plan to manage the coast for the next six years has been developed.

Although you may not think so at first sight, the **Star Ascidian** or **sea-squirt** (*Botryllus schlosseri*) is actually a colony of individuals closely related to animals with a backbone. Each segment of the 'star' is a tiny animal that sits within a jelly-like matrix and filters microscopic particles of food from the surrounding seawater. These filters are some of the finest in the animal kingdom and can even filter bacteria out of seawater.



ou don't find many blind animals, but the **Chitons** (right) fall into this category. You can usually find them stuck to flints and they peacefully graze algae off the surface of stones. Like limpets, they have a single large foot, which sticks firmly to rocks. As the animal glides over an irregular surface, the Chiton's eight jointed armour plates allow it to bend so that no soft parts are ever exposed. There are several species to be found on the Thanet shore, although the one pictured is the most common – *Lepidochitona cinereus*.

Even though these little gems are small, they are just as important as the shore crabs and shannies and need to be looked after in the same way. So always remember to carefully replace stones the same way up as you found them and follow the Thanet Coast Seashore Code when you are in the rockpools.

HIDDEN GEN Hen you're next exploring the lower part of Thanet's rocky shores,

When you're next exploring the lower part of Thanet's rocky shores, rummaging under boulders and stones, keep a sharp look out for some of these 'little gems'. They may be small and hard to spot, but beautiful when you look as closely as Ian Humpheryes does here!



his beautiful little sea anemone (right) is called *Sagartia troglodytes*. Unfortunately we rarely see it open like this unless we are lucky to spot them in shallow rock pools. When you turn over a stone, they are often attached underneath looking like a pale yellow blob on a stalk with all their tentacles retracted inside. At high tide, they patiently wait for little shrimps and water fleas to stray into their arms. Immediately upon contact, paralysing threads are shot into their prey and the animal is drawn into the central mouth to be devoured. All sea anemones are immortal so look after them, they might have been around for a very long time!



his little furry animal (above) that hangs upside down beneath rocks and over-hangs is the **Purse sponge** (*Scypha cilita*). Sponges are some of the most primitive of all animals; some can be put through a sieve and will gradually reform into a sponge, just on a smaller scale! Water is sucked in through tiny holes in the sponge's body and squirted out of the large opening at the top, trapping food particles inside. There are many types and forms of sponges around Thanet, from small erect forms like Scypha to large encrusting sheets that can cover the underside of an entire boulder.

North East Kent Marine Wildlife Watching Code

The Thanet coast is home to one of the southeast's biggest populations of seals and naturally they attract a great deal of interest from people. Sadly, 2006 has seen a dramatic increase in the number of watercraft reported to be causing a disturbance to the seals on the sand banks off the coast from Birchington and Margate. This can be particularly worrying during sensitive times when seal pups are being born – in the summer for common seals, and the autumn for grey seals.

The Thanet Coast Project and North East Kent Scientific Coastal Advisory Group have drafted a new Marine Wildlife Watching Code in conjunction with local ecotourism ventures and interest groups. These draft voluntary codes are available for comment in 2006, and will be produced as a leaflet for all watercraft users in North East Kent in 2007. DISTANCE

Keep your distance. Never go closer than 100 metres (200m if two craft are present) to seals or cetaceans, as they are easily scared.

SCATTERING

Avoid heading into wildlife – as this will scatter, scare and separate the group

STEADY

Maintain a steady and slow direction – with no wake – and avoid chasing or harassing wildlife.

TIME

Spend only a short time near the animals – no longer than 15 minutes.

YOUNG

Avoid getting close to groups with mothers and young – notably seal pups around in June/July & Oct/Nov.

RUBBISH

Take rubbish home with you and never dispose of litter or any other contaminants at sea.

Beach litter

- another fine mess you got me into!

Thanet is beautiful – let's keep it that way. That's the name of Thanet Council's new anti-litter campaign, which aims to show how much there is to be proud of in Thanet. It also warns people about the penalties they could face if they're found dropping litter.

The campaign features beautiful images of Thanet, including shots of Kingsgate Bay and Margate Main Sands. A3 posters and postcards of the images used in the campaign can be purchased at the area's Visitor Information Centres.

On the spot fines for dropping litter, which are issued by the Council's Environmental Health Enforcement Officers and Community Safety Wardens, will rise to £80 in September.

As well as not dropping litter, you can play your part to help by taking part in one of a number of beach cleans this autumn – focused around litter recording and collection for the annual Marine Conservation Society's 'Beach Watch' weekend on 16-17 September.

Balloons - Don't Let Go!

Sending colourful balloons into the skies may add a bang to a bash – but have you ever spared a thought for the damage they do to local wildlife. Whales, dolphins, turtles, sharks and fish are all known to have died after swallowing bits of balloons, which are often found on beaches and bays in the district. Many animals mistake floating debris, such as balloons, as food. The Marine Conservation Society is working to make beaches safer for wildlife by campaigning to stop balloon releases.

If you know of a planned balloon release you should alert the Thanet Coast Project. 
Windrider into action!
