Faithful to Thanet

Turnstone are 'faithful' to a particular bay with the same birds returning from Canada each winter to feed along these rocky shores. They feed on peeler crabs, shrimps & shellfish by turning over loose stones & seaweed with their bills.

Peace 'at night' and 'high tide'!

Turnstone also need to be left alone to rest (or 'roost'). They gather in groups at night & high tide. They would naturally select an undisturbed sheltered location, close to their feeding grounds. But because of disturbance, fewer birds are using these roost sites & are flying further away - using valuable energy.

Sailing

What can we do?

We must be prepared to share the beach with the Turnstone - as it is their home too - & they need to be given enough space to be able to thrive. We will need to take some action. The Thanet Coast project will be bringing together people representing different coastal recreational activities to think about how we can continue without causing unintentional harm to the Thanet's important birds & marine life. Coastal users will draft 'codes' for their own activities, deciding together what they should contain.
