Pacific Oyster survey of the North East Kent European marine sites

Wakame Undaria pinnatifida

A large, golden-brown kelp

Key ID features:

1-3m in length, consisting of a divided frond with a mid-rib



A type of brown seaweed

Key ID features:

A large olive-brown seaweed with fronds often over 1 m long

Chinese mitten crab Eriocheir sinensis

Acrab

Key ID features:

- Large trabup to 8cm across
- Grey-green to dark brown in

Pacific oyster Crassostrea gigas

A bival ve mollu sc

Key ID features:

Thick, rough, hinged shell up to 18cm long
